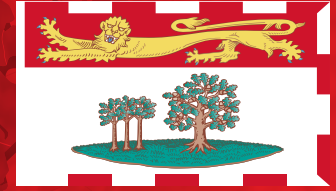




PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND MOTORCYCLE AND POWERSPORT ECONOMIC IMPACT

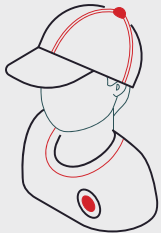
